### Skyhawks Meeting Report April 2, 2017

#### **Old business**

Todd has contacted Randy about the feasibility of a web page that would include members' contact information. As an alternative that would be easier to implement, Todd proposed emailing a Members Contact List. Members would have the option to not be included on the list.

#### Drone use at the field

A recent incident caused the need to have some discussion about the rules for members who fly drones (quadcopters and the like) at the Skyhawks field. In the incident mentioned, a drone took off from near the flagpole and flew down the fence line towards the North, then crossed the runway and went so far East that it had to be retrieved.

Todd stated that drones should follow the same rules we use for helicopters. Fly in front of the flight line from a pilot station, or go to the north end of the field in the hovering zone. If planes are in the air, a drone needs to follow the same flight pattern as other aircraft. If no other aircraft are in the air, the pilot can fly anywhere in the flight area. Keep in mind we don't fly farther than 1200' from the pilot stations on the N-S end, and 600' straight out.

Any aircraft using FPV capabilities (heads down) needs a spotter. This is to prevent the aircraft from flying outside the zone mentioned. All aircraft must be kept in visual line of sight at all times. If there are any questions, please contact Todd or one of the other officers.

#### Guests at the field

The question was raised about guest flying at the field. Permission can be granted for a guest to fly by any of the club officers. Some requirements are: Pilot must have current AMA, Pilot must be accompanied

by a Skyhawks member, Pilot must follow all AMA and Skyhawk field rules. If you know someone who would like to fly as a guest, contact one of the club officers and get permission.

#### **New business**

There was a short discussion about the poor condition of some of the picnic tables at the field. The question was raised if there are better tables available from the Parks Department. Wendell will check with the Parks Department.

#### **Pattern contest**

The pattern contest will be July 8th and 9th. There will be five classes of competition and a "Club Class." The Club Class has real basic manuevers that are not turn-around manuevers. Mark Barnett and Mark Woytassek will be providing more information about the contest.

### Show n' tell

Wendell brought a 1/4 scale Taylorcraft that is from the Merle Porter estate, the plane was given to the club and the proceeds will go to the Skyhawks club from its sale. It is a three channel control and powered by an O.S. .80 two cycle. The plane is in good condition and has some interesting features, including navigation lights and a custom muffler.


