Warbirds Over Iowa 2017 Report

The 15th annual event was held on the 21st of July. The winds were very low, but a cloudy sky and hot humid temps made it a bit uncomfortable. The runway was soggy after a heavy rain the night before. There were 27 registered pilots and almost 50 aircraft.

The bomber turn-out was weak last year, but this year they came out in force. Three of the pilots from the Des-Moines area joined up with Wendell to get four B-17's into the air at one point. It was great to see the four B-17's flying around, dropping bombs, and giving a realistic show to the pilots and spectators in attendance. Our event has always been special due to the number of bombers we get, and this year was no exception.

A contingent of pilots turnout out from down in Missouri once again. Steve Forest and Lyle Vasser demonstrated some excellent formation flying with their P-51's. They were joined by Mark Butrum's FW-190 who seemed to always end up smoking at the end of the flight (by design). Another treat was when they formed up with their B-24 and B-25 to do some tight passes. Steve Forest's B-24 is impressive with a 146" wingspan. He recently converted it from the four glow engines to DLE-20 gassers, and they seemed to work fine as he turned on his smoker system that put out four smoke trails. Steve's B-24 impressed the spectators and pilots alike, and he earned the Pilot's choice award for his efforts.

Once again Terry Peterson made the trip up from Elk Horn Iowa. He Flew his big Corsair and Top Flite Mustang in the usual fashion, upside down! He had a few great flights with his newest plane, an 80" Spitfire that earned him the Best Flight award. Terry has a few of those trophies that attest to his piloting skill.

The Cedar Rapids skyhawks turned out in force as well. Geoff Barrance flew his Tiger Moth, and Jim Stickley brought his 9.5' Wingspan Curiss Jenny. Don Harker had one of the most unusual planes of the event, a flying wing that he modified to represent the Horten 229 Flying wing from WW2. Gary Owen had his P-47 and FW-190 giant scale fighters on hand and flew often. Randy Lepsch had quite a few giant scale fighters. He spent the winter stripping and glassing his Top Flite P-51, the "Hawk eye Owan." He flew it well and earned the award for Best Mustang, a framed poster with 50 Mustang profiles on it.

Special thanks to all of the Skyhawks who chipped in to help with the event. Without the 26 volunteers the event could not happen. Additional thanks to Mark Woytassek and Kevin Gordon for running the flight line smoothly and safely. Dave Logan did a great job organizing the parking, a behind the scenes task that is very important when we get a good spectator turn-out. Jim Irvine showed up early and handled the sign-up booth as well as a multitude of other tasks we couldn't have done without. Harvey Hop manned the microphone and kept the spectators informed and entertained throughout the day. Rich Dean took some great photos despite the less than Ideal sunlight through the day.
