Jon says, "It has a sound generator on it and it really sounds neat." He also installed a larger motor and battery, and he says it flies "good and fast."

Diego Villalta brought his Aero Bipe he picked up at the I.C. swap meet. Sorry, I didn't get a pic of him with the bipe.

Don Harker brought his highly modified Opterra he is "bashing" into a Horton 229. Don is doing extensive modifications to this bird with front nose removal electric retracts, and plans full scale painting to be applied.

Gary Owen brought his new Graupner transmitter and explained some of the many features. This is one slick radio with advanced mixing capabilities and feedback from the receiver to the transmitter.

Steve Wilson brought his Herr Kit that he is planning to turn into a L9 Bird dog. The small size and detailing are very impressive. He plans for a finished weight of 45 grams total.

Mark Woytassek brought a couple of tool items he made on his plastic printing machine. One, a drill and locator bushing for drilling precision holes, and the other a device to mount an electronic angle indicator on standard incidence meter bars.

Todd brought his 1/4 scale C Y Models Arf LA-7 Lavochkin, powered with a 120 twin. Todd built the entire cockpit area from scratch as none came with the kit. It is detailed with instruments, etc. and the sliding canopy is also a "one off" by him. Many small details on the exterior were made using metal tape, airbrushing, etc., and the list goes on. It weighs in at 38 pounds.


