Show N Tell

Todd Davis brought his beautiful giant scale Kawasaki Ki-61 "Tony" which was built from an Arturo Zapata laser-cut kit. Following are some of the specs / details.

- 1:3.75 giant scale
- powered by a ZDZ 112cc inline twin gas engine
- 126" wingspan
- weighs approximately 44 lb
- scratch built cockpit that even has Japanese nomenclature on the instruments
- 1/4 scale Best Pilots' Saburo Sakai


Note about the color scheme. The white bands around the red meatballs indicate this airplane belonged to a home defense squadron.

Mark Woytassek shared a lot of detailed information and analysis regarding throttle curves. He used hand made charts to describe his findings. Turns out that throttle control is not linear in terms of transmitter stick position vs rpm vs actual thrust. For example, 50% stick position equals approximately 30% thrust. He encouraged everyone to consider making use of the throttle curve function found on practically all RC radios these days. Generally speaking, the throttle curve should be set up such that 50% stick position provides 70% throttle command output.
