Skyhawks Meeting Minutes

May 7, 2023

The meeting was held at the Hiawatha Library. It was called to order shortly after 7:00 p.m. by VP Steve Wilson. There were 12 members present.

Jim Doty gave the Treasurer's Report. There are currently 50 paid members this year, 10 of which are lifetime members. The insurance payment was received by the city of Cedar Rapids and the Port-o-Potty was delivered.

Secretary's Report from the March meeting was read by David Logan.

Old Business

• Silver Leader Club Status

Application for AMA Silver Lead Club status has been submitted to the AMA.

• Theme Days

Gene Thorn would like to have theme days at the field to encourage people to come out for club events. He suggested that we could have a cookout or food available and could possibly give a discount on the food for those who bring a plane matching the theme. It would not be limited to flying only those planes that meet the theme criteria. No discussion was held.

• Fross Park Event for Commemoration of Charles Lindberg Crash in Cedar Rapids The time and date for the event has been changed to the Center Point Museum (indoors) on May 21 at 2:00 p.m. Wendell checked with Jim Newman. The Curtiss Jenny will not be available for a static display. The event was mentioned on the May 7th KWWL evening news broadcast.

• Airfield Condtion

Staples are starting to come up under the overlapping seams of the mat. These were the staples that were put in to hold the edges of the mat down while it was being laid down. Mark Woytassek warned us to beware of this because if your plane hits one, it could take a nasty bounce. He went out and tamped them down.

New Business

• Suggestion for Maiden Flights on Airplanes

Mark Woytassek suggested that when working to sort out a new plane at the airfield or when attempting to maiden a plane, we should throw the manuals for our plane and radio in our toolbox or vehicle. That way if there are adjustments that need to be made or questions about setup, the information will be right at your fingertips.

• Weather Station

Mike Tope suggested that we have a weather station that could be remotely accessed at the airfield. Mark Woytassek said there is a weather station already at the soccer field,

though it has been off-line for awhile. He suggested we consider supporting the weather station financially or physically by offering to do maintenance on it. <u>www.mesowest.com</u> is the website. Choose Iowa and All Networks to find it. Some discussion occurred regarding possibility of installing solar panels at the site. It would require a large configuration and a fairly large battery configuration. David Logan mentioned that he sometimes has access to 55 Amp Hour batteries that are used.

• Illegal Dumping of Trash

Mark Woytassek mentioned he has witnessed people coming out to the field to illegally dump their trash.

Show and Tell



Wendell Maakestad brought his P-51, formerly Big Beautifull Doll, to show the transformation now that he has had it glassed and painted with a new scheme. Todd Davis assisted him with glassing, panel lines, and painting. He decided to use a scheme from a plane flown by Col. Don Blakeslee, one of the leading aces of WW2. He flew over 500 combat missions in 1,000 hours and did not decorate his plane with kill markings. He was discreet and humble. He led the 4th FG in Europe.



Gene Thorn brought in his "magnum opus." This is the Grumman Albatross, which he has scratch built for both water and land use. H started it in September, 2022. He still has some trim work to do an to build the landing gear still. He said this is the hardest plane he h ever built due to complex curves and angles. It has a 72" wingspan runs on 2 850 Watt motors using 2 2200mAH 3 cell batteries.



Steve Wilson showed off his Curtiss P-40 K-Model. He built this to model the one flown by Col. Scott of the Flying Tigers. This model is the Top Flite Giant Scale ARF. He has stripped it and glassed it. He is currently detailing the custom cockpit.
